FROM THE CHAPLAIN Has your child lost their spark?



We've all had those friends who demand more than you can give. They drain you of energy and make you feel bad about yourself. After trying to avoid them, the guilt sets in and you feel obligated to reach out again and put up with it.

This is not unique to adults, kids are the same. The difference is that children have much less control over their relationships and, in some cases, have to spend EVERY day enduring these unhealthy friendships at school. They will often put up with it, desperately hoping things will change. Here are a few signs that your child might be coping with an unhealthy friendship:

- They are less confident and negative
- They complain of stomach aches or headaches
- Their friendship circle is getting smaller
- They don't talk about their friends
- They start asking questions like, "Do you think I'm bossy or weird?"
- They make decisions that aren't aligned with their core personality

Some children don't know strategies for making relationships healthy again. Here are some tips that might help:

- 1. Ask specific questions like: "How are things going with Lisa? Does she make you feel good about vourself?"
- 2. Share your own experiences when you were their ade.
- 3. Encourage them to spend time with friends who make them feel good and treat them with respect.


